To those now in its fold, Sex & Porn Addicts Anonymous has made the difference between misery and sobriety, and often the difference between life and death. S.P.A.A. can, of course, mean just as much to the afflicted who are not yet reached.

Therefore, no society of men and women ever had a more urgent need for continuous effectiveness and permanent unity. We addicts see that we must work together and hang together, else most of us will surely die alone.

The Twelve Traditions of Sex & Porn Addicts Anonymous offers, we believe, the best answers that our experience has yet given to those ever urgent questions, "How can S.P.A.A. best function?" and "How can S.P.A.A. best remain whole and survive?"

- 1. Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon S.P.A.A. unity.
- 2. For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as he may express himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
- 3. The only requirement for S.P.A.A. membership is the desire to stop acting out sexually and viewing pornography.
- 4. Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or S.P.A.A. as a whole.
- 5. Each group has but one primary purpose—to carry the message to the sex & porn addict who still suffers.
- 6. An S.P.A.A. group ought never endorse, finance or lend the S.P.A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.
- 7. Every S.P.A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.
- 8. Sex & Porn Addicts Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- 9. S.P.A.A., as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.
- 10. Sex & Porn Addicts Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the S.P.A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- 11. Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, TV, radio, films & Internet.
- 12. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principals above personalities.
